### CUP FINALISTS BROUGHT DOWN TO EARTH WITH A THUMP Old Suttonians 1 3<sup>rd</sup> XI 5

The Suttonians team, having last week beaten Albanians to reach Cup Final status, were expected to be a tough side to beat. The 3<sup>rd</sup> XI were strengthened by the return of Andy Udale and Nick Mole whilst Nick Tarn completed a trio of changes, none of whom were particularly tall but all could play football!

Kicking off with the wind at our backs we quickly showed the opposition that tenacity and quick tackling was going to be the order of the day. We pressed hard from the off and within ten minutes **DUNCAN HAYWARD** found himself on the left-hand side of the area, beating one player before curling a right-foot shot around the stranded 'keeper.

Unusually for the 3<sup>rd</sup> XI we did not relax but began to play some of the best football I have ever seen from an Old Boys side and our second goal came soon afterwards when a cross from the left found **NICK TARN** hitting a fierce shot which ricocheted off both the 'keeper and a defender before going in. Continuing to press, the third goal came before the half hour when some excellent football between Andy Udale, Nick Tarn and **DUNCAN HAYWARD** enabled the latter to score his second with a right-foot shot.

At this point Suttonians attacked and Andy Udale made a valiant effort from a floated cross by getting two hands, his head, the cross-bar and the ball all to meet at the same time. The referee had no choice but to give a penalty and, for those who did not see the incident, Kelvin Wing did dive like a swallow but sort of 'flumped' to the floor as their centre-forward struck the ball wide.

This let-off spurred us on and our fourth goal came from a right-hand movement with excellent passing between Ashley Simpson, Clarke Quarrington and **NICK TARN**, with Clarke's near post cross being beautifully finished with a near post header from Nick. Suttonians, at this stage, were completely demoralised and half-time, in fact, proved to be their best spell!

Understandably we relaxed a little in the second half but still managed to score again, with **DUNCAN HAYWARD** getting his hat-trick from a far post header after Nick Mole and Nick Tarn had broken away from a Suttonian corner. With the score at 5-0 Kelvin Wng felt he was being left out of the scoring and another in-swinging corner from Suttonians saw him make his only mistake of the game and, in an effort to palm the ball over the bar, he flapped it into the net.

A tremendous performance from everybody, especially Andy Pullen and Si' Giles, who contained their midfield for 90% of the game, and we still lead the league and will continue to do so if we play like this.

The module 1 looks at developing the environment for your players and is an excellent course to attend for those looking to gain new knowledge.

### Course Details

Day 1 and 2: Monday 25th and Tuesday 26th April 2016 (9am-5pm)

Day 3 and 4: Monday 9th and Tuesday 10th May 2016 (9am-5pm)

Venue: East Barnet Old Grammarians FC, Alan Drive, Barnet, Herts EN5 2PU

The usual cost of the course is £125. However, for this course we are offering bursaries of £50 per candidate, bringing the cost to just **£75**.

#### UNDERSTRENGTH 1<sup>ST</sup> XI SETTLE FOR A POINT Old Garchonians 3 1<sup>st</sup> XI 3

The availability curse struck the 1<sup>st</sup> XI again on Saturday, with Bratterman, Akkaya, Karamath and Paton all ruled out, whilst, with goalkeeper Hilton already out for the next two weeks, and backups also unavailable, 16 year old school boy Toby Godwin made his Old Wilsonian's debut.

So the 1's travelled to Garchonians with a bare 11, with Tobi Oluwu stepping in at the last minute. To make matters worse the 1's were to play the game on astro turf, with power lines going across the field, not allowing you to clear the ball over five foot. It took many back to the rule of no ball being allowed over head height!

The game started off slowly, with it being more like a practice game on an odd surface. Garchonians went close from a few corners and the breakthrough was to come from a corner, as the wind took the ball and it floated straight in.

The 1's looked a threat on the break, with Childs shooting over from 18 yards. But they were back in the game with another piece of quality from **SIMMONS**, a right foot shot leaving the 'keeper no chance as it rocketed into the top corner.

Garchonians then put the 1's under pressure for the last ten minutes of the half, with their numbers 10 and 11 both going close. But the game finished 1-1 at the break.

The 1's started the second half better, passing the ball forward and playing in the other half. But it was Garchonians who took the lead when the ball broke to their left winger, who drilled the ball home from 30 yards.

The 1's struck back straight away when a great through ball found **SELLMAN**, who controlled the ball instantly and his swinger of a left foot did not disappoint. **SELLMAN** then got his second soon after when a Parkinson header was saved by the 'keeper but Sellman pounced to volley home.
