FA YOUTH AWARD MODULE 1 – APRIL / MAY 2016

FA Youth Award Module 1 announced for April and May 2016!

The module 1 looks at developing the environment for your players and is an excellent course to attend for those looking to gain new knowledge.

Course Details

Day 1 and 2: Monday 25th and Tuesday 26th April 2016 (9am-5pm)

Day 3 and 4: Monday 9th and Tuesday 10th May 2016 (9am-5pm)

Venue: East Barnet Old Grammarians FC, Alan Drive, Barnet, Herts EN5 2PU

The usual cost of the course is £125. However, for this course we are offering bursaries of £50 per candidate, bringing the cost to just **£75**.

To enrol on the course, candidates must:

- * Hold a minimum of the Level 1 Award in Coaching Football
- * Hold an in-date FA Emergency Aid certificate (within three years)
- * Hold an in-date FA Safeguarding Children certificate (within three years)
- * Be a member of the FA Licensed Coaches Club (recommended)

(We can work with candidates to bring their qualifications up-to-date but they must have a coaching qualification).

You have been warned

For the first time since I started editing this newsletter, which goes back 46 years, **NO-ONE HAS SUBMITTED A REPORT or even bothered to let me know the goal-scorers; where apposite.**

The only occasions when there have been no reports in the past have been when all games have been postponed, and when I learnt that four games had been called off this week, and all involved my most assiduous reporters, namely the 1st XI – thanks Chris, the 2nd XI – thanks Jamie, and the 8th and 9th XIs, who, collectively, have been virtually faultless over a number of seasons, I feared the worst.

Both the 3rd XI and 6th XIs seem intent on going through the season without submitting a report at all, and the perverse pride which, perhaps, they feel this brings – am tempted to conclude that, during their school days, they had the same attitude towards doing their home work!

The 4th and 7th XIs are only marginally better, with 2 and 5 reports respectively, whilst the 5th XI, after an encouraging start, have fallen by the wayside.

In the Christmas edition of “All the News that’s fit to print” - No, 1,570 – I encouraged a greater response and even printed suggested reports to cover every eventuality, but with little or no response. I also threatened to write reports of Palace games if things did not improve, so, and see below, this week I have called your bluff and, to avoid this happening again, you know what to do.

PALACE ON TRACK FOR TWO WEMBLEY APPEARANCES Reading 0 Palace 2

“We stand in the rain and we stand in the sun, we are South London’s Number One”

Crystal Palace, having been tipped by some for a top four place in the Premier Division, have seen the wheels fall off their league campaign dramatically, the consequence of long term injuries to key players, individual errors, the concession of very late goals and a general lack of form.

However, their progress in the Cup has been faultless and, ironically, all three games, which enabled them to reach this quarter-final tie against Reading, had been against Premier Division sides - Southampton and Spurs away, and Stoke at home, but this game saw them take on the only remaining team in the Championship and a backward step in the alphabet, namely from S to R.

The side showed one change from the team that had fallen victim to two late goals against Liverpool the previous week with Alex “I slipped, I stumbled I fell” McCarthy being replaced by Wayne Hennessy, with Emmanuel Adebayor again deputising for Connor “Four goals in two games but I’m injured – again” Wickham.

This was chosen as the Friday night game and everyone, bar the Palace supporters, were rooting for Reading as the under-dogs, as per the British tradition.

The Palace supporters themselves were, as ever, in fine voice:

“South London is ours, South London is ours “ - the rest of this chant has been faded out because this is a family publication – and out-sung the home supporters by a country mile, something which happens every week.

The first half of this game was indicative of The Eagles season as they created many chances but could not turn them into goals. “Yannick, Yannick Bolasie, runs down the wing for me “, sung the travelling support, whilst Wilfred Zaha, as ever, proved “He’s just too good for you, he’s just too good for you”, on more than one occasion.

In the second half the Reading goal-keeper, Ali al Habsi, who was adjudged ‘man of the match’, continued to defy anything and everything Palace could throw at him until, with five minutes to go, Bolasie was hauled to the ground and **YOHAN CABAYE’S** penalty did just enough to put Palace ahead – and put him into the leading goal-scorers chart of this publication!

There was just time for Zaha to show, yet again, that he was just too good for the Reading defence as he zigzagged across the edge of the penalty box before playing a short pass to Adebayor, whose perfect lay-off to **FRAZER CAMPBELL** saw the latter hit the post with his first effort before, and to his obvious delight, then planting the ball into the back of the net.

So it was Palace’s turn to score late goals and reach the semi-finals of the F.A. Cup for the first time in 21 years, which I will not be able to attend because the game will be played on the weekend of April 23rd/24th, which is Club Force. And should they reach the Final, to be played on May 21st, then I am due in Ashford for a game of OW cricket – sometimes CCF has a lot to answer for. Pikey
